


## London Decom 2022

## Summary


- 1626 tickets sold
  - 1450 general access
  - 83 low income
  - 93 direct sale to volunteers
- 148 people answered the Survey
  - 9% of ticket buyers
  - 13% in 2019
  - 11% in 2018

# How old are you?


- The majority of attendees are in their 30s
- Ages ranged from 22 to 67



# Where do you live?


- 71% of attendees live in London (77% in 2019 & 80% in 2018)
- 14% live elsewhere in England
- 3% live in France and 3% in Ireland
- Other countries represented included:

  - Denmark
  - Germany
  - Italy
  - Netherlands
  - Portugal
  - Thailand
  - USA

- 64% had an amazing night, down from 75% in 2019
- 35% had an OK night
- 1% had an awful night





 Responses were equivalent to 2018 but not as positive as for the 2019 event.

Art and Decor


Performances





- Over 48% of participants thought the art was amazing, up from 40% in 2019 and 34% in 2018
- The performances were also appreciated, with nearly 52% rating them as amazing, up from 30% in 2019 and 37% in 2018


# Theme camps




 Responses suggest that there was slightly less variety than in 2019

## Decom ticket price

- Full price tickets were £25 and low income tickets were £15
- Tickets have remained the same price since 2018.
- 34% said that they would be willing to pay more, up from 25% in 2019.




#### Queue




- 12% had a bad experience of the queue this year
- This compares with 1% in 2019 and 5% in 2018

#### Security




- Nearly a third of participants had a bad experience with security
- Multiple reports of aggressive behaviour.
- As one responder says, 'their vibe didn't match that of our event'

#### Cloakroom




- Deterioration from 2019 but not as bad as 2018
- Some reported avoiding the cloakroom due to bad past experience

#### **Toilets**




- Even worse than previous years
- Complaints that they were dirty, wet, smelly and blocked
- Not properly cleaned before the event start
- Toilet attendants universally unpopular (but were a non-negotiable condition of the venue)
- Long queue for the women's toilet

## Did you volunteer?



- 345 people signed up to volunteer via the volunteering platform (184 in 2019 and 55 in 2018)
- Some teams still reported that it was difficult to find volunteers
- 46% of those responding did not volunteer (44% in 2019 and 54% in 2018)

# Have you been to a burner event before?



- All respondees were at least aware that they were at a Burner event
- 87% had been to at least one burn event before

## Accessibility

- 3.7% of respondees reported having specific accessibility requirements
- Many commented that there was not enough seating available
- Report that some signage too small to read easily

## Leave a Better Trace (LBT)

- 88% were already aware of the Leave a Better Trace message before Decom
- 68% reported that these messages played a role in their Decom preparation
- 51% recycled an old costume and a further 21% made their costumes
- Only 3% bought a new costume, while 5% bought their costume second hand
- 82% of burners brought their own cup to Decom (although some bar staff insisted on giving out plastic cups anyway!).
- The cleaners thanked us for leaving the venue in such a good state.

## Consent

- Decom has its own dedicated consent team.
  - 57% of participants were aware of this (63% in 2019).
- 12% reported experiencing some non-consensual touch or verbal harassment from staff, volunteers or guests at London Decom (up from 4% in 2019).
- 25% of participants visited Buttered Crumpet (the play space), while 22% didn't find it. 24% weren't interested.
- Several reports of security behaving inappropriately in this area
